Make your way to Millennium Park for free evening concerts under the elegant metal curls of the Frank Gehrydesigned Pritzker Pavilion. Pick a seat or get comfy on the expansive lawn. The Downtown Sounds series continues this month with genre-busting Maps & Atlases and the San Francisco-based psychedelic rock band Wooden Shjips (Aug. 4). The following week (Aug. 11) features instrumental metal band Russian Circles and sax whiz Colin Stetson. Sounding off for its 80th year is the Grant Park Music Festival through Aug. 16 and highlighting the talents of the Grant Park Orchestra and chorus. More of a jazz junkie? Catch several of the masters on Thursday evenings this month including guitarist Fareed Haque (Aug. 21) and an ensemble from Chicago, South Africa and London who present a musical homage to Nelson Mandela (Aug. 28).

Lunchtime on the lawn rewards visitors with musical interludes at the pavilion for Grant Park Music Festival rehearsals and docent-led talks.


Young music fans dance away their sillies with kid-friendly performances under the Family Fun Festival tent every day at 1 pm. Through Aug. 24.

In the 10th anniversary outdoor art exhibit "Millennium Park: An Anatomy in Photographs," John Vinci of local firm Vinci/Hamp Architects (they've contributed to the preservation of landmarks like Wrigley Field and the Tribune Tower), 58 images by 16 photographers offer a peek at before, during and after construction. Some of the pictures were meant to document the process of building Millennium Park, which took four years longer than originally planned. And some depict the park in all its current playful, busy, beloved glory.
